#### A message from Pastor Kaila ...

At the annual meeting we voted on our community covenant. This has been part of the Healthy Start process. One of our goals is to grow in deeper relationship with God and with each other through communication. The beginning statement of the covenant says "As members of the Christian community of Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer in Fort Morgan we commit, with the help of God to relate to each other through Christ, and thus hold ourselves and each other to;" 12 things.

As I have stated the past couple of months, each month I will focus on one of the 12 things - on what it means and how God and our call as Christians help us live into this covenant that we have made with God and with each other. In February, I spoke on the first point in the covenant to "Listen to each other," in March I spoke on the second point of the covenant to "Respect the privacy of those who confide," in April I spoke on the third point, "Challenge each other with the truth. Be willing to confront when it is important," in May I spoke on the fourth point on how we are to "Deal

with people directly," in June I spoke on "Strengthen each other." And in July I spoke on "Being gentle with one another."

In the month of August when our summer vacations and adventures are coming to an end, we may find ourselves beginning to get into a routine; our seventh point in our covenant is that:

We commit, with the help of God, to relate to each other through Christ, and thus hold each other to:

• Do not speak ill of others in the fellowship. "Beloved, do not grumble against one another so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors!"

James 5:9

I just spent a week in Detroit with 30,000 Lutheran youth and youth leaders and over again we heard the call to love our neighbors and to RISE UP TOGETHER. One of the artists, Agape, (who is a Lutheran rapper) had t-shirts that said "Love your Haters". Here at LCOR we just recently finished vacation Bible school and each day had a theme; Even though you're left out ... Jesus loves you. Even though you're different ... Jesus loves you. Even when you don't understand ... Jesus loves you. Even though you do wrong ... Jesus loves you. Even when you're afraid ... Jesus loves you.

I think that both events, the youth gathering and VBS, are both lessons that we all need to hear, not just the youth of the church, but young and old alike. When we speak ill of others we are hurting the Body of Christ - when we say hurtful, hate filled things - it hurts our fellow brother and sister in Christ. Instead, we are called to love others, even our haters. We are called to rise up against those who say hurtful, hate filled things against others and ourselves—to tell them that it is not okay to say those things. Jesus was constantly Rising Up for others and we are called to Rise Up too!

**Prayer:** Loving God, help us to speak love towards one another, help us to have faith in you to show each other grace, love, and forgiveness. Help us to continue to reconcile our relationships so that we can be in right, honest, loving relationships with our brothers and sisters. That will lead to growing into a deeper, caring, loving relationship with you and with one another! Give us courage and strength to RISE UP against hatred, oppression, racism, sexism, ageism, and all that tear down love. Help us to show one another the unconditional love that You show us! Amen.

This is the main fundraiser for WELCA. It funds congregational gifts, donations to Lutheran charities, a charity which translates the Bible into different languages, kitchen supplies and coffee for fellowship, meats for funeral meals, and so many more things! We ask your support!

We would like to ask you to go through your homes and find things which you do not use to donate to our sale! We ask that clothing be laundered and appliances in working order. We cannot accept the old desktop computers and monitors since the charities will not accept them if they are unsold. I did sell the four TVs donated last year, so we will accept them. We also ask you to donate plastic grocery bags and newspapers to wrap glassware.

We need women and men to help us prepare for the sale on Sunday, August 9 after the service and fellowship. On that day, we remove all the chairs, move tables, bring in display tables, set up the clothing racks, bring things down from the attic, and in from the donation room. We really need everyone's help that morning!

We need help posting signs with tape and

thumbtacks all over towns in the businesses, restaurants, and shops you use! Flyers will be available for you to post. We also need them posted in the local motels and other places where our customers might see them. People see our posters far more than they read the newspapers! Please ask permission to post our signs!

All during the week, we sort, clean, hang, and display donations to get ready for the sale. Whether you are a morning person or an afternoon person, you can come anytime you are able to help us! Work and rest as you are able! We keep some coffee and snacks ready for breaks! We have lots of fun chatting as we work.

On Saturday at about 2:00 p.m., we start packing up everything unsold to box and bag for donations. It is a huge job; so again, we need the help of many! We need to take all the clothing off the hangers and pack it, get the hangers returned to the attic, the clothing racks are taken apart and returned to the garage, the display tables need to be carried out to the garage, and all the boxes need to be taken to the last Sunday school room to await pick up by a charity.

So you see, there are so many opportunities to serve and help us to raise money! Besides that, come to shop! You never know what you will find! We will also have our Rada knives and cutlery for sale. Thanks so much for your support!

#### Ask, Thank, Tell ...

As the Stewardship Committee reads the book, <u>Ask, Thank, Tell</u>, by Charles Lane, the committee members will be summarizing each chapter for the monthly newsletters.

This month, I will summarize Chapter Two: It All Belongs to God.

On behalf of the LCOR Relay For Life team, I would like to extend a huge THANK YOU for your continued support of Relay For Life and helping the American Cancer Society!!! - 2. Respect the privacy of those who confide. "A gossip goes about telling secrets, but one who is trustworthy in spirit keeps a confidence." Proverbs 11:13
- 3. Challenge each other with the truth. Be willing to confront when it is important. "Rather speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." Ephesians 4:15-16
- 4. Deal with people directly. Don't complain to others. "If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone" Matthew 18:15. If someone complains to you about another member, help that person follow this principle.
- 5. Strengthen each other. "[Speak] only what is useful for building up ... so that your words may give grace to those who hear" Ephesians 4:29. "The test of true ... Christian community is that it serves to make the individual free, strong and mature," not "weak and dependent." Bonhoeffer, p. 88
- 6. Be gentle with one another. "My friends, if anyone is detected in a transgression, you who have received the Spirit should restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness." Galatians 6:1
- 7. Do not speak ill of others in the fellowship. "Beloved, do not grumble against one another so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors!" James 5:9
- 8. Do not judge each other. "Therefore you have no excuse, whoever you are, when you judge others; for in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, are doing the very same things." Romans 2:1
- 9. Pray for one another. "Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective." James 5:16
- 10. Confess your sins to one another. James 5:16
- 11. Forgive one another. "Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give and it will be given to you." Luke 6:37b-38a
- 12. Freely participate in the Body of Christ according to your gifts and talents. "As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.'" Matthew 10:7
